Last month your city council and staff were hard at work meeting to develop the upcoming budget for the city's 2021-2022 fiscal year. Improvements to our parks was a key point of interest discussed during our budget retreat. We focused on some long-awaited investments in our parks, including construction of bathroom facilities at Carol Fox Park. Over the years, this has been requested by numerous parents who frequently use that park, and I am pleased we are finally moving forward.

Your city councilmembers also focused squarely on easing the property tax burden faced by our citizens. In 2019, we increased the residential, over 65 and disabled exemptions across the board, and I am looking forward to seeing our council enact similar increases in the coming months.

This month also marks the start of the 2021 Atlantic hurricane season. This cannot be said enough: please ensure your family maintains adequate supplies and develops a plan in response to potential hurricanes and tropical storms.
